Seminole Work Opportunity Program

SWOP is a sheltered workshop for developmentally disabled adults in Seminole County. The funds will be used to provide work equipment for the disabled.

SPCA of Central Florida

SPCA maintains shelters for homeless/abused pets. They promote aggressive spay/neuter programs, youth/adult education, cruelty investigations/prosecution and human support programs. The funds will be used to help defray the costs of the low/cost spay-neuter programs and thus continue to reduce pet overpopulation and the use of euthanasia as a means of control.

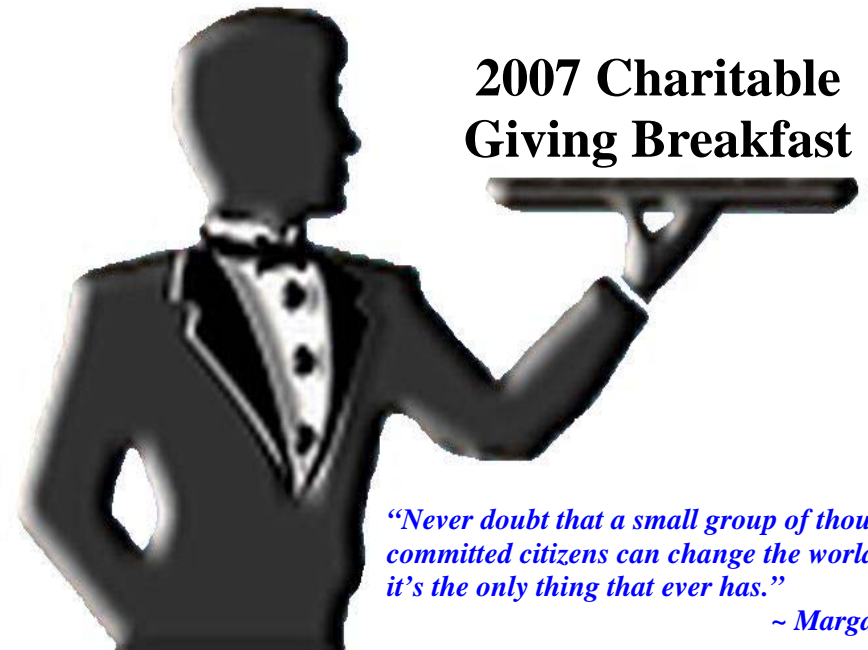
